The trees are all ordered and the first delivery will arrive at the beginning of November.

National Tree Week 2023

This year National Tree Week will run from 23 November through to 3rd December, it is the UK's largest annual tree celebration, marking the start of tree planting season. National Tree week is about building awareness of the important difference planting trees can make to our planet, whether you plant one tree in a pot on your doorstep, a hedge in your garden or, a woodland as part of a community event.

The 'Planting Our Future' team will be working on several projects during National Tree Week, including planting Celebration Trees in Hope Coppice which have been sponsored by local residents.

During last years tree planting season numerous communities supported in planting 25,000 trees across the borough, from creating new orchards to hedgerow habitats, to singular trees and multiple larger scale planting projects.

Helping to raise the number of Female Foresters

Solihull Council & idverde UK are supporting equality in the forestry sector with their Female Forestry Apprenticeship, helping to grow equality in the sector.
