## Volunteers clean-up at Queen's Gardens in Chelmsley Wood



Another fantastic community clean-up day was organised last month by Pablo from <u>Clean & Green</u> at the Queen's Gardens, opposite Asda in Chelmsley Wood.

The green space, located next to the Kingshurst Brook, has been maintained by the group, alongside Love Solihull, throughout the year. There has also been support from other organisations like B37 Project, Marston Green Lions and Colebridge Trust, to name a few.

Volunteers recently set to work cutting back overgrown vegetation, re-painting benches, removing graffiti, as well as

retrieving trollies from the river, to be returned to local stores.

The latest clean-up was well attended, with representatives from West Midlands Police, <u>Solihull</u> <u>Community Housing</u>, Asda and the Council's Civil Enforcement team (<u>Marston Holdings</u>), really demonstrating whole community collaboration.

Solihull Council recently installed an accessible picnic bench in the circular area to be enjoyed by local residents and mounted a beautiful plaque in recognition of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, which commemorates Queen Elizabeth II's visit to Chelmsley Wood Shopping Centre in 1971. The plaque now serves as a centrepiece in the gardens, acknowledging the support of volunteers who help to keep the area clean.
